Measure A Essential Health Care Services Tax

n March 4, 2004, 71% of Alameda County voters passed Measure A, which imposed a half-cent sales tax to support emergency medical, hospital inpatient, outpatient, public health, mental health, and substance abuse services to indigent, low-income, and uninsured adults, children, families, seniors and other county residents.

Services Provided by Measure A

- Asthma education, in-home case management, advocacy, and service referrals by Asthma Start
- Free tattoo removal services, support service linkage, mentoring, and guidance and support to atrisk, adjudicated, or formerly gang-involved youth and young adult by Project New Start
- Health education, exercise programs, and nutritious meals for seniors by the City of San Leandro and Senior Opportunity for Seniors
- Chronic disease, injury prevention, and obesity prevention by the Public Health Department
- Community capacity building and partnerships to promote health, education, and violence prevention
- Youth development, health and wellness programs, including Life Skills, nutrition, and fitness workshops, for youth

Impact on Alameda County

- More than 8,000 San Leandro seniors received health services and screenings in a year.
- 5,000 warm, nutritious meals delivered in a year to homebound seniors by Meals-On-Wheels.
- 1,301 students received dental screenings, examinations, and fluoride and dental sealants in a year from the Office of Dental Health.
- 99% of children with asthma served in Asthma Start maintained or improved to the lowest level of symptoms post case management.
- 135 newborns hearing screenings, 393 audiological evaluations, and 122 Head Start hearing screenings conducted in a year by the Center for Early Intervention on Deafness.
- More than 500 East Oakland residents received free screenings (blood pressure, cholesterol, and blood sugar), health promotion, and information about community activities in a year.
